Free school meals/Pupil Premium

The net earnings threshold of £7,400 for eligibility for FSM and the early years pupil premium were introduced from 1 April 2018 – this will typically equate to an overall household income of between £18,000 and £24,000 once benefits income is taken into account. The previous eligible benefits have been rolled into a single benefit called Universal Credit. Since September 2014, all children in Foundation and Years 1 and 2 have qualified for **free school meals**, regardless of their family income, but only the children who would qualify for free meals under the above income-based criteria will receive the pupil premium. If you are eligible the school will receive £1320 for 6 years. This can be used in a variety of ways including:-

- Extra teaching support if required
- Breakfast/after school club and other clubs
- Music lesson
- Educational trips
- Resources such as laptops or tablets
- School uniform

If your child qualifies for free school meals, it's important that you tell us – even if they take a packed lunch – as this enables you to claim pupil premium.
